This funding will be used to

- provide every classroom teacher with an additional one hour each week of Professional Learning Time to work in their year level teams to develop and embed the Australian Curriculum in English and Mathematics through the development of units;
- develop a team of knowledgeable others to support the explicit use of focussed learning questions, learning intent and the co – constructing of success criteria through the participation in the Leading Learning Collaborative in the South East Region;
- provide classroom teachers and teacher aides with the knowledge and skills to explicitly teach reading (including phonics and phonemeic awareness) and writing through professional development;
- provide teacher aide time to support small group interventions with a focus in reading (including phonics and phonemic awareness) in Prep to Year 2;
- provide teacher time to support inclusive practices;
- provide resources to support the implementation of the Australian Curriculum in English and Mathematics;
- provide support for Classroom PBL Implementation through a PBL coach for the development of skills in teachers and aides through professional development and coaching support.

Our initiatives include

- embeding whole school process for developing units of work In English and Mathematics through PLTs with a focus on using moderation using the BAAE model
- focussing on a whole school approach to the teaching of phonemic awareness, phonics, grammar and spelling;
- focussing support in reading in order to improve the students' reading comprehension;
- developing teacher knowledge in leading classrooms where learning questions are understood by teachers and students to improve learning outcomes through our participation in the Leading Learning Collaboratively project;
- providing resources to ensure consistent practice in phonics, spelling, grammar and phonemic awareness and writing;
- small groups in guided reading to allow for strategic grouping of students;
- purchase of online literacy support materials to assist students in developing skills and knowledge around digital technologies;
- providing coaching and feedback to embed classroom PLL skills across all teaching staff.
